'Tell Them From Me' Survey Results (Brendan Kiely)

The *Tell Them From Me* survey was conducted from 12 May to 5 June 2025, with responses received from 48 parents.

Parent feedback from the survey plays an important role in guiding the school's future planning and decision-making.

One key suggestion was to consider developing a marketing strategy that highlights classroom activities and internal achievements. While external promotion is strong, there is room to improve internal engagement and communication.

2025 NAPLAN Results (Kate de Bressac)

Kate shared this year's positive NAPLAN results with the SCF.

The data has been unpacked within teaching teams, with staff engaging in reflection and developing hypotheses around performance in key learning areas.

New Business (5mins)

Guest Speaker – \$1,000 Grant Opportunity

A \$1,000 grant is available through the Diocese of Lismore to fund a guest speaker.

Suggestions are welcome for potential speakers and topics—one idea raised was Belle Smith from *The Root Cause*.
