### **Educational Topic (20mins)**

Diocesan Anti Bullying approach (Bronwyn Shipton, Catholic Schools Office)

Bronwyn shared current research on bullying and practical strategies that families can use to support children. She emphasised the importance of a timely and united response when bullying occurs.

Key points included:

- Overview of diocesan policies and procedures, including how schools respond to bullying incidents
- Common myths and misconceptions about bullying
- Open invitation for questions and discussion from attendees

**Key Message:** "Tell us early" – early communication is essential in addressing bullying effectively.

#### What the School is Doing – Presented by Kim Post

Kim outlined the school's proactive approach to bullying, including current initiatives aimed at building students' capacity to respond positively and respectfully.

Highlights included:

- Whole-school implementation of Personal Development, Health and Physical Education (PDHPE)
  lessons for students in Kindergarten to Year 6, focused on developing knowledge, skills, and
  understanding related to respectful relationships and personal safety
- Use of social circles as a tool to strengthen peer relationships and promote respectful communication

#### Business arising from the minutes of previous meetings (15mins)

#### Aggies' Golf Fundraiser Update – (Grainne Ducat)

- Support is requested to ensure smooth running of the event, particularly with volunteers needed from 3:15pm onwards to assist with getting players onto the course, welcoming them back in, and raffle ticket sales. Community help is appreciated in promoting the raffle.
- Donations of prizes and auction items are still being sought all contributions welcome.
- The golf committee have reached out to Nashy Pix in the hope they may frame the signed NRL jerseys at a reduced cost or pro bono.

#### Term 4 School Events (Donna Sprague)

- SCF chose not to take on the disco and colour run in 2025, hoping school could step in here.
- Donna advised plans for the following:
- 3rd December Christmas story and carols organised by school, either on the oval or under the shelter (out of school time family event)
- Disco incorporated as part of end of term treat day for students (in school time)
- Colour Run will take place in 2026.

#### Boronia Street Safety – (Allison Ritchie)

- The Council's response to safety concerns on Boronia Street does not address the real, daily risks experienced by school families.
- The feedback was considered inadequate and missed the key issues raised.
- The matter will be revisited, and an alternative approach considered to prompt a more appropriate Council response.

### Shade Structure Progress – (Donna Sprague)

• The structure has been installed, and is now awaiting completion of the roof.

#### Guest Speaker \$1,000 Grant

- This will be revisited in upcoming meetings.
- Suggestions for potential speakers or topics are welcomed from the community.

## Garden Update – (Simon Hersee)

- The vegetable patch is now operating at around 50% capacity, with seeds and seedlings planted.
- Students are engaging enthusiastically it's proving to be a valuable hands-on learning experience.
- Simon thanked the SCF for their financial support in making the project possible

#### **New Business (15mins)**

#### 2025 World Teacher's Day – Friday 31 October (motion)

Allison Ritchie put forward a motion to spend up to \$350 to show our appreciation to all staff on World Teachers Day. Kate Burrell seconded. All voted in favour. Motion passed.

Allison to coordinate the coffee van for the Lunch 1 break on 31 October and look into the possibility of something for the assembly that day.

#### Year 6 Camp 2026

At the 2024 Colour Run, the SCF sold show bags, with proceeds previously agreed to be directed to lowering costs for parents for the 2025 Year 5 and Year 6 camps. \$20 per student was contributed to the 2025 Year 6 camp, however, camp information and costs were circulated to the current year 5 cohort before a SCF subsidy could be finalised.

Allison Ritchie put forward a motion to allocate \$10 per current year 5 student, to be held by the SCF and contributed to their year 6 camp early next year. An additional contribution will be looked at early in 2026.

Lauren Van Boxtel seconded the motion. All voted in favour. Motion passed.

Considerations include, but are not limited to, assessment data, peer dynamics, learning and behavioural needs and the ratio of boys/girls within classes. Teachers on specific classes will not be known at this time and requesting a classroom teacher for your child cannot be assured.
